Welcome to another year of service! If you are like me, you are excited to discover how we might serve others to make lives better for women and children in our own communities, our country and worldwide.

I would like to start by thanking Linda Kaletch for her years of service to this organization. She has reminded us that we are Lifelong Learners and that we can continue, each and every day, to learn something new that will lead to better living. Thank you, Linda! As you can see from the title of this article, my theme for the next three years is "Making a Difference." From the time I was a little girl, I have lived my life to make a difference for others. I often thought about how my mother, grandmother and other female relatives would be remembered as time carried on. They were not known worldwide but offered their gifts in their localities. My grandmother was a nurse and did home health care long before visiting nurses became a viable business. My mother often spoke of how her and my uncle played on the front steps of a home of a person whom Grandma was administering care. My mother took pride in the fact that she was the longest running "Room Mother" in our community, serving in this capacity for me and siblings' classes for a period of over 25 years. She also was an Extension Homemaker for over 25 years, helping to raise funds, host tea parties and bake sales and supporting the programs of Homemakers. Because of her efforts in our community, upon her death, more than 600 people came to pay their respects to her life and service. What a wonderful remembrance and better than a tribute edition of People magazine!

My own service began when I about 8 years old. Service in my church and through Brownies and Junior Scouting were my main focus. Through my grandmother's encouragement, I became a "Candy Stripper," a hospital

volunteer, pushing the book cart and offering cheerful greetings to patients. 4-H and Future Homemakers Association were added in Jr. and Sr. High School. Over the years, I have continued to serve school parents' organizations, my church and various committees within, through Extension Homemakers and my community through leadership and community organizations. My service through Extension Homemakers has allowed me to lead at the County, District and State levels. I now serve through NVON, CWC and ACWW at the national and international level.

It was at the 2016 ACWW Triennial Conference dinner that I had my most eye-opening reminder of how important service can be. A lady from an African country at my table leaned over and touched my arm before addressing me. "I want to thank you for all that your country does for my community in regards to helping us to obtain clean water through new wells and water filtration." I had to stop and think—What had I done? I had mindlessly thrown a few coins into a bag in the middle of the table to assist in whatever the fund raiser was. Little did I think about how those "pennies" would be used. Now, I was being thanked for a gesture that I had not given much thought. That was a life changing moment. My future actions would be mindful and deliberate, planned and generous. I was ONE person but my actions could affect COMMUNITIES. That was huge!

There is a refrigerator magnet saying, "Well Behaved Women Rarely Make History." I challenge you to become a woman who can make history, seeking out service that can Make a Difference.

Father and Daughter crusade for clean drinking water worldwide

Tuesday Night Dinner, July 22, 2020



During Tuesday night's dinner, Lou Haveman and daughter Natalie Lambert from Grand Rapids, Michigan will share how Business Connect World and Connect For Water are addressing the needs for clean drinking water in the world and more importantly, how NVON is being a resource and making a difference to those in need.

We first met Lou Haveman, a lifetime veteran of international ministry and business and his wife Jan at the 2015 NVON Conference in Martinsburg, West Virginia during the last year of the first 3-year Project in Common, Water Around The World. At that time his company

began helping us locate areas to supply water filters to those through Business Connect World his global humanitarian business, *Creating Hope Through Business*.

Business Connect World's mission is to provide citizens living in the global south with affordable and easy access to clean water, through the creation of a sustainable, local business mode.

Their purpose is to give hope to the impoverished by creating employment, in the marketing of life enhancing products, within a business model that is sustainable and environmentally balanced. Our values define who we are: Employment, Faith, Profit, and Transparency. Our team members come from various business backgrounds and we embrace business with enthusiasm and an entrepreneurial spirit. Our lives reflect decades of service, both locally and internationally. We seek a greater network, more encompassing, more resources, increasing impact. And we are so grateful that NVON is helping with this purpose through the Water Around The World project.

We will toast the success of our seven-year project.

Making a Difference, “Working Together for 25 Years, 1995-2020”

Who remembers back to 1994 when members from several states met at the CWC, USA Area Meeting and agreed there was a need for a connection with ACWW and the USA societies. In 1995, the National Volunteer Outreach Network was established, an Executive Committee was elected, an advisor was appointed, Presidents from Arkansas, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, South Carolina, West Virginia and Wisconsin became the charter member states, by-laws were prepared, a Certificate of Incorporation was issued and a Not For Profit status was granted.

The First NVON Annual Meeting was held in August 1999 in Indiana with an annual meeting every year since. A silent auction was held to benefit the ACWW Pennies for Friendship Fund and in order to have a common focus throughout the membership, the decision was made to select a Project in Common. When a group of women decide there is a need, they get the gears rolling and they have been rolling ever since.

This year is the 25th year since the National Volunteer Outreach Network was organized. Just think of the accomplishments!

Tour #1 Walnut Grove Plantation



8:15 am - 11:15 am

Take a trip back in time as we take a guided tour of Walnut Grove Plantation, established in c. 1767 by Charles and Mary Moore

who raised ten children in the house they built and lived in for 40 years. The Moore's supported the patriot cause during the Revolutionary War and mustered local militia at Walnut Grove prior to the Battle of Cowpens. Many of the outbuildings used in the 18th century still remain. These include kitchen, blacksmith shop, wheat house, barn, meat house (built in 1764), wellhouse with dry cellar, school and doctor's quarters.

Spartanburg is the home of BMW's first manufacturing facility outside of

Germany for the "Ultimate Driving Machine," the "X" model sports vehicles, Zentrum (the history museum & collection) and BMW's gift shop. Attendees will take a one hour guided walking tour of the manufacturing plant (7-million square feet where employees and robots make 1,500 vehicles a day from start to finish. ATTN: Walking distance is about 1 mile, **completely enclosed shoes required (toe and heel) NO EXCEPTIONS.** A waiver must be signed.

SPOUSE/FRIEND TOUR - Tuesday, July 21, 2020 - 8:15 am - 4 pm Hub-City and The Beacon - Cost \$21 - Limited to 14 people



We'll start with a tour of the historic Southern Railway Union Station Museum which shows how railroads were connected to the textile and peach industries in South Carolina. Over six railroad companies made Spartanburg the "Hub" of railroading in the upstate of SC. Our next stop will be to Twitchell Auditorium at Converse College, one of the South's leading performance venues since 1898 hosting entertainers like John Philip Sousa, Tony Bennett, Chet Atkins, George Burns, Duke Ellington, Burl Ives, Itzhak Perlman and Yo Yo Ma. Going behind the scenes, we will tour the 1,500-seat facility which includes a 2,700 pipe organ. Before heading to The Beacon Drive-in for lunch we'll walk through the Oakwood Cemetery featuring Hells Gate and learn how it got its name. Then to lunch at The Beacon which is ranked as the second largest drive-in restaurant in the US and serves over one million customers a year yearning for their special beef or chili-cheeseburger "a-plenty", piled high with French fries and onion rings. From lunch we'll drive by two huge pieces of the Berlin Wall (a Kodak moment), several historic cotton mills, Spartanburg Methodist Church and the Spartanburg Regional History Museum before returning to the Marriott. \$10 will be provided for lunch.

SPOUSE/FRIEND TOUR - Wednesday, July 22, 2020 - 8:15 am - 4 pm Cowpens National Battlefield - Cost \$20 - Limited to 14



We'll visit the National Park's Revolutionary War Battle of Cowpens historic site which in 1861 was the pivotal battle with the Patriot Army under General Daniel Morgan (several streets and facilities in Spartanburg are named after him) and the British forces under Colonel Tarleton. We will talk with Park Rangers, see a film, walk and ride the actual battlefield which was the turning point of the Revolutionary War in the southern colonies. We'll have lunch at the Bantam Chef (a 1950's "blast from the past" restaurant), drop by Strawberry Hill USA for fresh peach ice cream (on your own), and end with a visit to Red Boarder Distillery for a taste of real southern moonshine). \$10 will be provided for lunch.

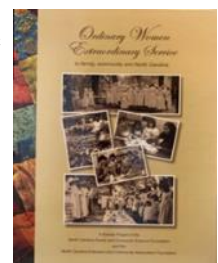
Silent Auction
